LEGAL/LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

Brad Weissman gave the Legal Update – Chief Judge Tuter's recent order permitting limited discovery in risk protection proceedings, i.e. production of records attached to the petition and/or intended to be used during the final hearing and limited depositions. He also discussed the recent United States Supreme Court decision of *Byrd v. U.S.*, which held that a driver of a rental car who is not on the rental agreement has a reasonable expectation of privacy in the vehicle. However, this opinion does not confer an expectation of privacy to an individual who has stolen the vehicle. Additionally, the Court left open the question of whether a person who obtains the rental vehicle by fraud would have an expectation of privacy within the vehicle.

PROGRAM
